

CARDINAL NEWMAN COLLEGE 16- 19 TUITION FUND STATEMENT 2021/2022

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is ring-fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 institutions who receive annual funding allocations from ESFA for the provision of 16 to 19 education, to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

The funding is to support small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 in English, maths and other subjects that have been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning. Students aged 19 to 24 who have an education, health and care (EHC) plan are also eligible for support.

All students must be on a 16 to 19 study programme and the funding should be used to support the tuition activity above and beyond the programmes of education already planned. Institutions should have regard to the needs of students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), particularly where they have experienced additional disruption to learning because of their specific needs and disabilities. Institutions may choose to use this funding to support eligible learners with SEND to catch up on vocational and academic skills, and skills and learning that are important for their preparation for adulthood, subject to them meeting the eligibility for the fund.

AT CARDINAL NEWMAN COLLEGE WE WILL DELIVER THIS FUNDING TO PRIORITISE THE FOLLOWING:

- Support in GCSE Maths and English including individual tuition for our English as an Additional Language students.
- Subject-specific support targeting students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Other support well as support from our Additional Learning Support Team and Foundation Learning, including progression for students with an ECHP.
